

SEDA One-day Workshop

Towards European Standards for Teaching in Higher Education

Thursday 24th January 2008, 11.00am – 3.00pm, London



The drive to establish a European Higher Education Area increases the need for understanding between nations across all aspects of higher education, including staff and educational development and the development and qualification of teachers in higher education. This workshop will offer information and tools to facilitate the further engagement of UK developers with this process.

Participants in this event will be invited, supported and prompted to:

- Reflect on and analyse the educational development provision and processes within their institution;
- Relate their courses for initial and continuing development of staff who teach and otherwise support learning to the emergent NETTLE meta-framework for standards frameworks;
- Relate their work to approaches being adopted elsewhere in Europe, and thus additionally gain insight into the impact of national context on educational development;
- Locate their educational development work in relation to the Bologna Process.

The role of the Bologna Process in stimulating developments across Europe will be illustrated and discussed. The non-UK facilitator will provide a unique insight into the process and challenges of establishing a common understanding of standards for training university teachers in their country.

The workshop will provide participants with NETTLE outputs including the NETTLE meta-framework and institutional case studies.

Workshop facilitators

Paul Riddy is the leader of the NETTLE (Network of European Tertiary Level Educators) project, a European thematic network with members in 28 countries. NETTLE is developing reference frameworks and case studies to support educational development.

David Baume is an international consultant on educational development, and acts in this capacity for the NETTLE project.

Maarten van de Ven is the Director of Educational Development at the Educational Expert Center, Rotterdam, and a partner in the NETTLE project.
