Open Space Technology (OST) is a more creative way of running meetings and other events, though is not necessarily suitable in all situations. It runs on two fundamental principles: passion and responsibility, to engage those involved and ensure that things get done.

In this workshop we will present OST, through experiencing it in a pure form as designed by its originator, Harrison Owen, and then consider how the principles might be applied in other situations.

Our experience is that OST can be challenging, creative and fun. It can produce more imaginative outcomes than traditional meetings and involve everyone in devising and taking responsibility for resulting actions.

Aims

- to give participants the opportunity to experience Open Space Technology (OST) as a way of running more creative sessions
- to reflect on the principles and practice of OST and consider the situations in which it might be best used and how to deal with problems
- through individual activity, co-consultancy and feedback, and plenary discussion, to enable participants to develop a plan for using OST in their own context
