Professional Standards and CPD for Academic Staff: challenges, issues and ideas

Thursday 9th March 10am – 4pm
University of Westminster, London



The Higher Education Academy is now publishing the results of the consultation on professional standards, and in staff and educational development units many of us are moving into the final stage of our 'Supporting Professional Standards' plans. The recent SEDA conference on professional standards highlighted some of the challenges people are facing in working with a wide range of university staff on CPD routes and also shared some of the exciting and innovative work people have been doing in this area. In response to requests at the conference, this one day seminar we will be an opportunity to examine further the implications of the standards and some of the work in the sector which has come out of the SPS funding. We will be looking at:

- Incentives for engagement with CPD
- building on PG Cert's in Learning and Teaching for a wider range of staff, including those in CETLs
- strategic approaches to supporting professional standards
- possible tensions between standards, development and academic roles
- building links and bridges across institutions for effective CPD

Our exploration and sharing of examples will be informed by both research and experience and the session will be highly interactive and useful. Discussions will be led in the morning by **Liz Shrives**, Director of Educational Development at Roehampton University and **Liz Warr**, Writtle College who have both been involved in developing innovative structures for CPD.

She is an Educational Development consultant and currently Director for Learning and Teaching Development at Roehampton University.
